

WELCOME TO THE HIKING AND WALKING TRAILS OF RIDLEY CREEK STATE PARK

Blue Trail: At 3.7 miles round trip, the Blue Trail begins at Picnic Area 9, descends 150' to Ridley Creek, then climbs 200' through the heart of the Park (1.4 mi total) to a 0.9 mi loop that passes by Picnic Area 14.

Orange Trail: This 2.0 mile hike starts at the pull-off on Gradyville Road just north of the bridge over Ridley Creek. Descend about 75' to the Creek, cross a footbridge, and climb slightly to the beginning of a 1.3 mile loop that includes over half a mile along the creek. Total elevation change is about 200'.

White Trail: This 4.3 mile loop can be accessed from Picnic Areas 9, 16, or 17. As it winds through the park, elevation change is about 700'. **Yellow Trail:** This 3.7 mile linear trail begins at the mansion parking lot, winds around the park, passing Picnic Area 17 before ending at Area 16. Elevation gain and loss is around 550'.

Multi-Use Trail (MUT): This paved 4.2 mile loop is popular for walking, running, and biking. It is closed to cars except for those who live in historic homes along the MUT. About 0.8 miles is along Ridley Creek and provides access for fishing.

Around the Mansion: A paved footpath winds around behind the Mansion and gardens to the Yellow Trail trailhead. You can also walk the Yellow Trail, cross a footbridge, and in a couple hundred yards turn left at a trail marker post, cross another footbridge, and turn right on the paved path for a one mile loop back to the Mansion.

Trail Markers: Trails are blazed. Posts mark intersections with other trails and roads.

- Please keep dogs on leashes.
- Bikes are allowed on the MUT but not the hiking trails.



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
